
Changes to Allotment Rules and Regulations

The Committee have been busy updating our contracts, constitution, rules and regulations. The bulk of the work has been done by Kirsty, our Secretary and there are a number of reasons why it was necessary. Firstly, we needed to align our regulations with our new contract with Knaresborough Town Council. Secondly, we wanted to clarify what is acceptable practice regarding cultivation, weeds, bonfires, use of chemicals and rubbish, etc.

Thirdly, we want to include the practice of plot inspections, so that members know when inspections will take place and exactly what is expected. Finally, we feel it is time our allotment rules reflected changing styles of cultivation and prioritise environmental issues.

A <u>big</u> thankyou to Mike Prest, from Knaresborough Horticultural Society, forcoming and giving us pruning demonstrations and advice. Throughout the weekend, over 45 people attended. They particularly appreciated the individualised advice and recommendations, such as the use of hops around raspberries and fruit bushes, rather than risking the transfer of diseases from woodchip.



Mike is also running demonstrations on sowing seeds and growing in containers,

at Moorland Nurseries on the last two weekends in March.



We do try to discourage individual bonfires, so we are planning a communal bonfire on Monday 17th or Tuesday 18th March (weather dependant).

Normal rules apply; no treated wood, nonorganic material or weeds etc. It is a good opportunity to have a tidy up and collect material suitable for burning.

Items can be left this weekend, on the grass, next to Mr Noddings bench (half way down the track).



Many of our plot holders are members of Knaresborough Horticultural Society, which regularly hold interesting talks and demonstrations.

Their next meeting is on 19th March at the HUB, St John's Church. Doors open at 19.00pm and the talk, from the Yorkshire Mushroom Emporium, begins at 19.30pm. Admission for non-members is £5.
